First crop yearlings by Tweenhills' sire Sleeping Indian continued to be well received at the sales. The highlight was the colt out of the Cadeaux Geneureux mare Hidden Meaning realising 90,000gns at Tattersalls October Sale Book 2.

Knocked down to David Redvers he is set to go into training with Dennis Coakley for owner Chris Van Hoorn. This half brother to listed winner Senor Mirasol was admired by several bloodstock agents. Agent, Hamish Alexander said: "He was the most outstanding individual and certainly the stand out yearling of the sale. He is a fantastic example for the stallion."

"We are thrilled by the way the Sleeping Indian yearlings have been selling, how athletic they look and that they have been going to good trainers. He has a huge chance with 99 registered yearlings to run for him next season," said David Redvers.

Rated 95p by Timeform his trainer David Elsworth was delighted, commenting: "We are thrilled with the horse. He has plenty of size and scope, and is an exciting three-year-old prospect."

Another Trade Fair juvenile highly regarded by their trainer is the filly Basle. Following her maiden win, trainer Gay Kelleway said: "We'll put her away now and she'll be a different horse over further next year. I can see her making up into a Group horse when she strengthens up."

GROUP 1 MARES TO BE OFFERED AT ARQANA

Tweenhills will be selling two exciting high class broodmares at the Arqana Breeding Stock Sale in Deauville on 5th December.

Lot 33 is Security Interest, the dam of Radiohead, this year's star Tweenhills two-year-old, winner of the Norfolk Stakes (Gr.2) at Royal Ascot and runner up in the Middle Park Stakes (Gr.1) before meeting trouble in running in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile (Gr.1). She is being offered by Haras du Mézeray, and is in foal to Elnadim.

Lot 154 is Dame Edith, the dam of dual Gr.1 winner Voix du Nord is to be sold in foal to first season sire and five time Gr.1 winner Duke of Marmalade (Danehill), consigned by Haras de la Reboursière et de Montaigu.
